NEW CHAPTERS

After serving 30 years, Don Crabtree ended his tenure and presidency on the NSDA Board. The Don Crabtree Distinguished Service Awards were named in his honor. Pam Cady Wycoff succeeded him, becoming the second woman to serve as Board President, and Dr. Tommie Lindsey, Jr., was elected Vice President the first African American in a Board leadership role.

The Asian American coaches' caucus was added to the program at the 2018 National Tournament.



2018

In the aftermath of a mass shooting tragedy at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Broward County Public Schools, host of the 2018 National Tournament, a "Powerful Voices, Meaningful Changes" program was held prior to Nationals to recognize the power of youth voices to elicit change. The 2018 National Tournament awards assembly began with a moving tribute to the victims of the tragedy. Student members of Broward County debate programs who led the "March for our Lives" movement that followed were honored as the 2018 Communicators of the Year.

COVID-19 PANDEMIC

For the first time since World War II, the NSDA was forced to cancel in-person competition at the National Tournament due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In a historic show of resilience, the 2020 National Tournament was held entirely online, becoming the largest ever with over 6,000 participants. That year, Storytelling and Impromptu became official supplemental events.


SPEECH AND DEBATE GOES DIGITAL





To further support students after the online National Tournament, the NSDA rolled out an online platform called NSDA Campus, which allowed more than 1,300 speech and debate tournaments to be held online that year, supporting hundreds of thousands of competitors during the pandemic.

Thanks to the generosity of The Julia Burke Foundation, the NSDA launched the Springboard Series in 2020, which offers free, online scrimmages and weekend tournaments.

CONNECTED ONLINE

For the second year in a row, the 2021 National Tournament was held online due to the ongoing pandemic, breaking the previous year's attendance record with over 8,000 global participants. The NSDA also introduced a new member benefit, allowing all high schools two student entries in supplementals at Nationals. The Indigenous Persons coaches' caucus was added to the National Tournament program.

A free, online NSDA National Conference promoting more equitable and inclusive speech and debate communities was held in August with over 700 registrants.

2022-2023

IN-PERSON COMPETITION RESTORED

After a two-year hiatus, the 2022 National Tournament returned to inperson competition in Louisville, Kentucky. The Middle School Nationals and Online Supplemental Events division remained virtual until returning in 2023.

A new opportunity, the NSDA Last-Chance Qualifier, was offered for high school students who did not qualify through their district tournament to have a chance to attend Nationals in their main event through a secondary online competition.

EXPANDING LEADERSHIP


The NSDA Board of Directors voted to create a Competition and Rules Leadership Committee and moved to an all-appointed Board of Directors to ensure diversity in identity, skill set, and background, as well as promote the organization's sustainability and vision/mission fulfillment.

The NSDA presented the Activating Equity Award to Ann Marie Baines, the founder of the non-profit organization The Practice Space, which supports young people and adults in developing authentic, clear, and engaging voices through speech and debate.

Following the passing of former Board member, Hall of Fame coach, and National Tournament awards emcee Tim Sheaff, the NSDA named the Timothy E. Sheaff National Awards Stage in his honor.
