

## **A Bill to Provide Assertive Community Treatment to Veterans in Crisis**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) programs will be provided to  
3 veterans suffering from mental illness related to their term of service.

4 **SECTION 2.** ACT includes programs such as Mental Health Intensive Case  
5 Management and is geared toward allowing patients to live  
6 independently while receiving services.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Veterans Health Administration will fund this program in the amount  
8 of \$200 million for fiscal year 2017. After a review of the program to  
9 determine its effectiveness, this may be renewed by the Secretary of  
10 Veterans Affairs.

11 **SECTION 4.** This will take effect on October 1, 2016.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to End Civil Commitment for Sex Offenders**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** States are no longer permitted to use open-ended civil commitment to  
3 imprison convicted sex offenders once they have completed their  
4 sentence.

5 **SECTION 2.** Civil commitment refers to the practice of transferring sex offenders to  
6 mental institutions for an undefined period of time after the completion  
7 of their prison sentence until they “no longer pose a threat.” This does  
8 not refer to sex-offender registration programs.

9 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Justice will oversee enforcement of this legislation.  
10 **A.** States found in violation shall forfeit their grant monies from the  
11 Office of Violence against Women (OVW) programs until they are in  
12 compliance.

13 **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect 6 months after passage.

14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Promote Computer Coding Requirements In Schools**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Grants in the amount of \$250 million per year shall be provided to states  
3 that require computer coding as a graduation requirement.

4 **SECTION 2.** Traditional PC programming and mobile platform application coding are  
5 both eligible for grant consideration.

6 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education will administer the awarding and oversight  
7 of these grants. These grants are renewable for a period of five years.

8 **SECTION 4.** This will take effect on September 1, 2016.

9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Discourage Export Tourism**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** A tariff of 25% shall be placed upon any declared goods in excess of  
3 \$3,000 retail value which are purchased in the United States and  
4 exported to China or Chinese controlled territories, if such items were  
5 purchased in the course of tourist activities.

6 **SECTION 2.** This shall not apply if the purchaser is a registered exporter.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Department of State and the Bureau of Consular Affairs will enforce  
8 this legislation.

9 **A.** Items found in violation of this law shall be confiscated.

10 **SECTION 4.** Upon passage, this shall take effect on June 1, 2016.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Return Overtime Pay to American Workers**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The 2004 Amendments to the Fair Labor Standards Act covering the  
3 definition of exempt employee and overtime pay is repealed.

4 **SECTION 2.** Only those employees and positions considered exempt prior to 2004  
5 shall continue to be exempt from overtime regulations.

6 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Labor shall be responsible for enforcement of this  
7 legislation.

8 **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect six months after passage.

9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Allow for Sensible Gun Ownership**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article  
3 is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States,  
4 which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution  
5 when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states  
6 within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

7  
8 **SECTION 1:** The second amendment to the constitution shall be amended to read “As  
9 a strong military is necessary to the security of a free state, the right of  
10 the people to keep and bear arms when actively engaged in the security  
11 of the state shall not be abridged.”

12 **SECTION 2:** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate  
13 legislation.



1 **WHEREAS**, Iran has only recently agreed to a nuclear accord; and  
2 **WHEREAS**, the leadership of Iran has not yet demonstrated that they are trustworthy;  
3 and  
4 **WHEREAS**, multi-party talks on the Syrian civil war are extremely delicate; and  
5 **WHEREAS**, Russian insistence on Iranian participation is designed to deflect attention  
6 from Russian interference in Syrian affairs; and  
7 **WHEREAS**, if these talks are not handled in a sensitive manner, it could further  
8 destabilize the region; now, therefore, be it  
9 **RESOLVED**, By the Congress here assembled that the United States refuse to participate  
10 in multi-party talks if Iran is allowed to participate in the negotiations.

## **A Bill to prevent Medical Professionals From Discriminating**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Any medical practitioner who receives reimbursement payments from  
3 Medicare or Medicaid is prohibited from denying treatment on the basis  
4 of sexual orientation or gender identification.

5 **SECTION 2.** In addition to denying treatment to the patient himself/herself, violations  
6 of this law shall also include such practices as refusing to treat patients  
7 on the basis of sexual orientation of other family members and refusing  
8 referrals to other medical personnel.

9 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Health and Human Services shall oversee  
10 enforcement of this legislation. A medical practitioner found in violation  
11 of this legislation shall be ineligible for further reimbursement payments  
12 from Medicare or Medicaid for a period of not less than five years.

13 **SECTION 4.** This will take effect upon passage.

14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



## **A Bill to Protect Privacy on Electronic Networks**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Posting personal information on an electronic network without the  
3 permission of the individual shall be a Class E Felony.

4 **SECTION 2.** Electronic networks may include social media, internet web pages, or  
5 other methods using wired or wireless networks. Personal information  
6 may include name, address, birthdate, pictures, or any other information  
7 not otherwise publically disclosed.

8 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Justice will coordinate with the Federal Bureau of  
9 Investigation to enforce this legislation. If it is found that data  
10 transmission was intrastate only, then information will be shared with  
11 appropriate law enforcement officials.

12 **SECTION 4.** This will take effect on July 1, 2016.

13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Resolution to**

- 1   **WHEREAS**, the Clean Power Plan will seek to limit carbon emissions; and  
2   **WHEREAS**, this limit is a key element to United Nations energy policy; and  
3   **WHEREAS**, these limits on carbon emissions will have a detrimental effect on American  
4                      oil companies; and  
5   **WHEREAS**, the economic recovery is currently stagnating; and  
6   **WHEREAS**, the harm to oil companies will lead to an economic downturn; and  
7   **WHEREAS**, alternative energy programs have been shown to be inefficient; and  
8   **WHEREAS**, the United States should not concern itself with the environmental concerns  
9                      of other countries; now, therefore, be it  
10   **RESOLVED**,   By the Congress here assembled that the Clean Power Plan shall not take  
11                      effect.
