Background Knowledge


Critical Context



What is background knowledge?

- The general context that surrounds the question
- Broad knowledge on a range of diverse subjects
- History, Economics, Geography, Political Science etc.
- Not time specific, still useful next week or next year





Why Does it Matter?

- Helps you understand current events
- Provides the basis of analysis
- Gives direction for research
- Allows you to explain complex topics to your judges



How to get it?

 Read broadly and voraciously, on any subject you can get your hands on.

Take your 'normal' school subjects seriously. Much can cross apply!

Pick a subject and dive deep. Can be very helpful in round.



Drills: Background Knowledge

Drill #1:

- Take an article, and write down every relevant concept it references.
- Spend 10 minutes researching each of them.
- Give a 1 minute speech explaining each.

- Pick a random Country/State.
- Off the top of your head, name five facts about it, and one fact about how it impacts its neighbors.
- Go learn five more.



Current Events

The Core of Extemp



Habitually read a variety of sources





Current Events Reading

1. Form a daily habit

2. Read for understanding

- → Don't skim headlines, read entire articles.
- → With Auto-Filing and Digital Extemp, volume is no longer the key, <u>understanding is.</u>

3. Find your sources

- → A news aggregator
- → Think-Tanks
- → Broad array of <u>diverse</u>, high quality sources



Drills: Current Events

Drill #1:

- Pick a current event.
- Deliver a 1 minute speech outlining the events that lead up to it.
- Do so <u>without</u> referencing any sources.

- Name 5 developing stories off the top of your head.
- For coaches: make it a competition, see who can name the most.



Analysis

- Ties together your background and current events knowledge
- Used to provide a thoughtful answer to the question
- Allows you to make predictions and analyze variables
- Differentiates mediocre from excellent speakers
- Can't be faked. Has to be learned.



Drills: Analysis

Drill #1:

- Pick a current event.
- Come up with three possible future scenarios.
- Determine what variables influence them, and which ones are most probable.

- Select on article that takes a stance on an event.
- Disagree with that stance.
- Provide reasoning and evidence to support your point.



Logistics

The prep time details





Logistics

1. Practice with your files

- → Whether you use Extemp Genie, Dropbox, or a tub of articles, practice with it.
- → If you use Genie watch the videos at extempgenie.com/documentation

2. Develop a prep routine

- → Every round follows the same format
- → Develop a systematic way to tackle the question and prepare your speech
- → Removes uncertainty, helps with nerves, improves quality



Drills: Logistics

Drill #1:

- Take a practice question.
- Use your files to find relevant content.
- Familiarize yourself with your system, and see how quickly you can find what you are looking for.

- Write down your prep time routine.
- Pick a practice question.
- Run through your routine.



Presentation

Extemp is not a lecture, it is a performance.

Make your speech engaging, not dry.



Engaging the Audience

- Judges are people too! Remember you are speaking to humans, not computers.
- All standard presentation hallmarks apply, pace, variance in pitch, proper gestures, eye contact etc.
- Extemp material can be dull, keep it interesting!
 - Good Intro/Conclusion
 - Use humor when you can
 - Interesting, well thought out analysis and content
- Presentation skills take time. Get as much speaking time under your belt as possible.



Drills: Presentation

Drill #1:

- Tape yourself presenting a 1 minute section of an Extemp
 Speech
- Identify part of your presentation to improve
- Deliver the speech section again
- Repeat until you are satisfied.

- Make speaking a part of your daily reading habit
- After reading an article, deliver a short summary



The Drill to End All Drills: Practice Rounds!

- Get practice questions. Google for them, use Extemp Genie's included questions, or even better write your own.
- Simulate the entire round.
- Make sure you deliver your speech in front of an audience if possible.
- If you don't have an audience, tape the speech.
