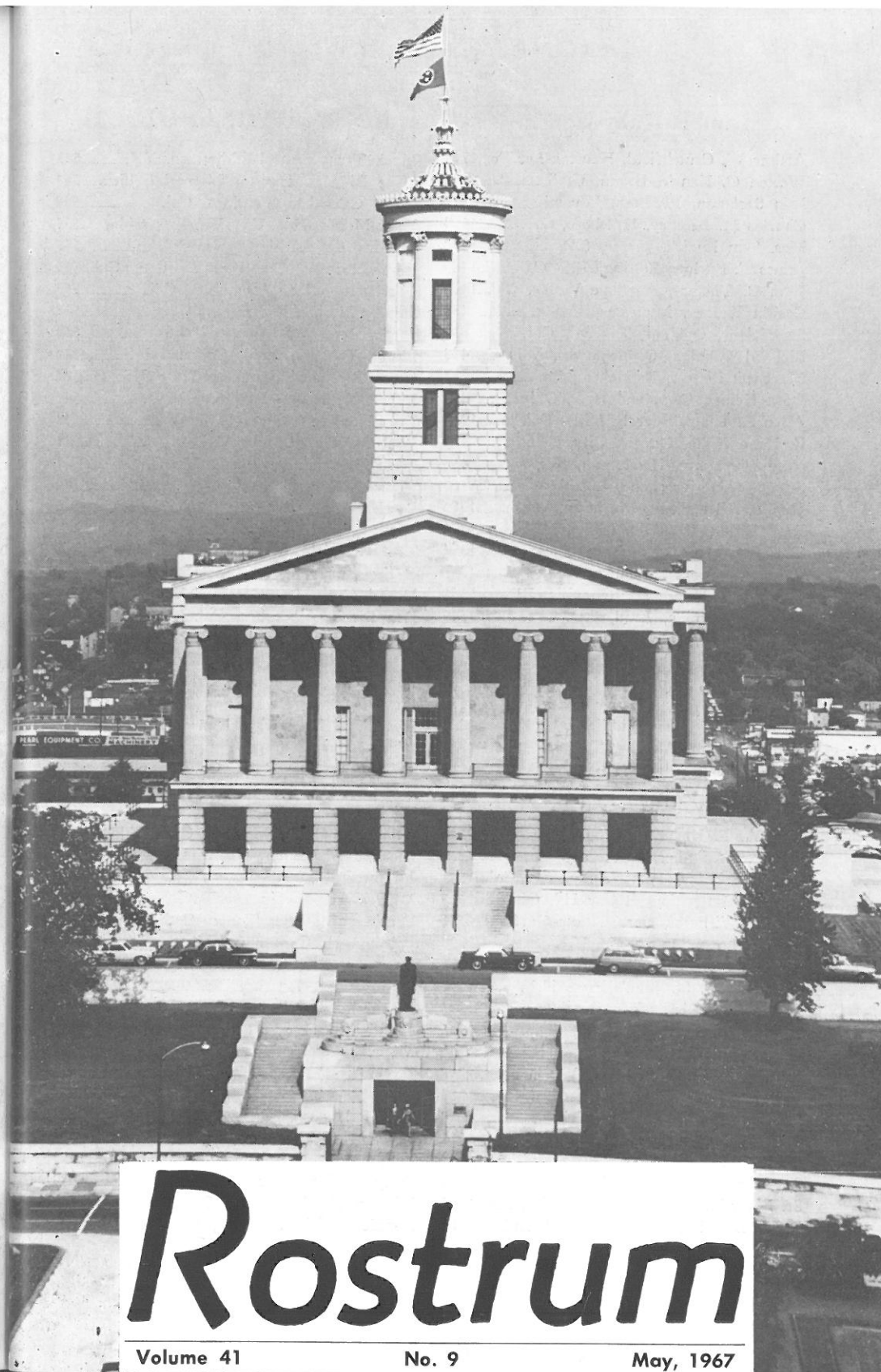

There Are No Guarantees

A Letter from the Editor

Many debaters have at some time regarded debate as an artificial exercise, divorced from what we call the "real world" and of little application in actually making policy decisions. We think that one cause may be the "quest for certainty" typical of many debaters. Negatives will point to the present system's ability to *guarantee* a certain situation, while the affirmative plan can only *hope*. Or affirmatives will characterize the present system as "trusting to *luck*" and will claim *certainty* for their proposal.

There are no guarantees. Policy argument necessarily involves dispute over "ought" statements. In support of "ought" statements we may introduce matters of fact about which we are reasonably certain. But we cannot possibly draw *guaranteed* conclusions about what we ought to do. We make inferences, which are inherently uncertain and at best attain a high degree of probability. We can watch B follow A a thousand times, but we have no guarantee that it will on the 1001st. The philosopher Hume recognized this uncertainty in writing about salt dissolving in water. The rhetoricians recognized it much earlier, devising the construct of the "rhetorical syllogism."

If their work has application for debate (and this too is uncertain, of course), it is that we should give more thought to what the *probabilities* are that certain consequences will ensue from the action we take, and to what the reasons are that such consequences would be desirable. We should give less credence to claims of guarantee, realizing that the claims cannot be demonstrated or proved. When we recognize the inherent indeterminacy of policy argument we may be on the way to fusing the "debate" and "real" worlds and arguing realistically, probabilistically.

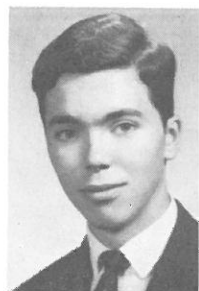

Featured here are the eight seniors with the highest point totals. District Tournaments, not included in the totals, may alter the final standing going into Nationals.

In first place at press time is **Lyndon Smith** of Columbia Dreher, South Carolina. He has qualified for the Nashville Nationals in both debate and original oratory. Previously, he attended the National Tournaments at both Omaha and Albuquerque, where he

placed second in radio speaking. Twice he won the state debate championship and the NFL District debate championship. He won original oratory at the 1966 Miami Beach Forensic Festival.

Lyndon is student-body president at Dreher. He is also a member of the Honor Society, the Key Club, and the Intra-School Council, and is a National Merit Finalist. He is interested in dramatics, and has had leads in three productions. His future plans include college attendance at Yale and a career in law.

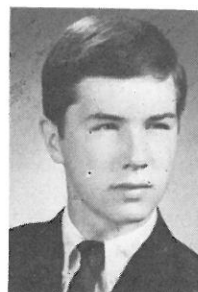

Debate colleagues **Cory Wade** and **Tom Curtis** from Sunnysvale-Fremont, California, hold second and sixth

positions, respectively. As juniors, they reached the National Semifinals last year. Cory also placed second in extemp.

Cory is a member of the California Scholarship Federation and the National Honor Society, and is an award winner for the National Council of Teachers of English. Her article on extemp appeared in the December **Rostrum**. She lists as special interests church activities, creative writing, and playing the guitar. At press time she was still deciding between Stanford University and Santa Clara University. Cory attended summer speech institutes in 1965 at Ohio State University and in 1966 at Northwestern University. She plans to teach English and write.

Tom is interested in speech, government, and English. He was junior class president and is a member of the Student Council, the Key Club, the Russian Club, and the National Honor Society. He is also a broadcaster on closed-circuit school television. He plans a college major in political science and a career in law and diplomacy. He too was at press time undecided about college choices, considering Stanford, Santa Clara, and Northwestern.

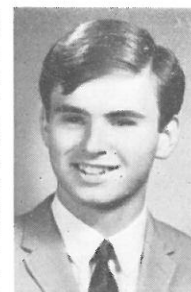


Stewart

Students from Pittsburgh-Central Catholic occupy positions three and eight. **William Stewart**, president of the NFL chapter there, is in third place. He has attended the National Tournaments in Omaha and Albuquerque, and has qualified in debate for the Nashville

Nationals. He was a member of the second place team at the Miami Beach Forensic Festival and the winning team at the Georgetown University Cherry Blossom tournament. He is the co-author of the article on inherency appearing in the February **Rostrum**.

Mark Zang, NFL executive secretary at Central-Catholic has competed in original oratory for four years, lasting four rounds at the Albuquerque Nationals. He also won the State championship in persuasive speaking as a junior. Mark authored an article on oratory scheduled to appear in the **Rostrum** next fall. An Advanced Placement student and National Merit Finalist, he hopes to attend La Salle College and major in philosophy.

Fourth and fifth places are held by Texans. In fourth is **Rufus T. Wright** of Houston - Memorial. Tim has won five 1st places in cross-examination debate in major competition this year. He attended the 1966 Nationals going five rounds in oratory and four in boys' extemp, and placing third in impromptu. He has qualified for the Nashville Nationals in boys' extemp, which he also won several times in local competition. Tim will major in political science and history at Washington and Lee. His other interests include politics, journalism, water skiing, tennis, and track.

Mike McKool of Dallas-Jesuit is in fifth place. He attended the National Tournament at Omaha, and qualified for the 1967 Nationals in debate. In 35 tournaments over a four year period, he has placed in 29. He is also a member of the Student Council, the National Honor Society, the school newspaper and yearbook staffs, and the Dallas County Youth Council, he will attend University of Notre Dame in the fall.

Seventh place in the nation is held by **Mary Incontro** of Omaha-Marian, Nebraska.

Where Are They Now?

Though now attending colleges across the country, most of last year's high point students and National Champions indicated continuing involvement in speech activities.

Chris Trower, who last year set a record high of 941 NFL points, is finishing his freshman year at the University of Virginia. Second-ranked **Michael Morris**, who also won boys' extemp, is debating on the freshman squad at Northwestern University.

Brad Rice, who was on the winning debate team and third highest point leader, has been actively involved in debate at Texas Christian University. His colleague, **Richard Bernard**, is at Oklahoma State.

Michael Macy, who was last year's number four point leader, is now at Harvard University. Fifth-place **Lyndon Smith**, then a junior, is completing his senior year at Columbia-Dreher and has doubly qualified for the 1967 Nationals. **Dick Kiefer**, in seventh place last year, is now attending Purdue University.

Judith Groeneveld, ranked sixth in the nation last year, is now at the University of South Dakota, competing in debate, extemp, oratory, and persuasive speaking, and planning a career in speech pathology. Tenth-ranked **Lynn Feaver** is now at North Central College in Naperville, Ill., majoring in speech and dramatics and giving thought to a teaching career. No response was received regarding eighth-place **Jeff Karrenbauer** or ninth-place **Vera Sadkovsky**.

Roger Davis, last year's Most Outstanding Senator, is at the University of Florida where he has his own show on FM radio. He plans to major in law and pursue—naturally enough—a political career.

Jane Scholz is now attending Michigan State University as a National Merit Scholar, and is planning a journalism major. She has competed during the year in extemp, the event she won last summer.

National Oratory champion **James Kay** is now at Pasadena College in Pasadena, Cal., planning to enter the ministry. **Joan Rue**, who is national champion in Dramatic Interpretation, is a theatre arts major at the University of Kentucky, planning a career in professional theatre.

Nashville Recreation Schedule Planned

A relaxed yet gracious recreation schedule is being planned for the National Tournament in Nashville, in keeping with the traditional easygoing Southern summer life. Highlights of the schedule include the following:

Sunday, June 18: Registration will be held at David Lipscomb College between 1 p.m. and 7 p.m. Lipscomb will be the tournament headquarters, where all students will be housed and most events will take place. The college is situated on a 65-acre tree-shaded suburban campus. Those driving should note the address at 3901 Granny White Pike.

At 7 p.m., contestants can walk

to the nearby Green Hills Shopping Center complex for a pizza party in the gay 90's atmosphere, with live banjo and rinky-tink piano music. A movie theatre and golf putting green are nearby. A separate buffet supper is being planned for coaches.

Monday, June 19: Registration will be reopened for late arrivals. At the morning session, Governor Buford Ellington, Mayor Beverly Briley, Dr. Athens Clay Pullias, president of Lipscomb College, and John Harper Harris, director of the Metropolitan Public Schools, have been invited to welcome tournament visitors. dent Congress will convene in the Senate chamber of the Tennessee State Capitol, the first time in recent years that the Congress has met in actual legislative surroundings. The tournament banquet will be held at 7 p.m. at the Municipal Auditorium downtown.

Tuesday, June 20: A reception has tentatively been planned at the Governor's Mansion in the late afternoon. There will be a special performance of **Under Milk Wood**, Dylan Thomas's play for voices, at 8:30 p.m. The house of the Circle Theatre, an arena-in-the-round, has been reserved for NFL for the evening.

Wednesday, June 21: A sight-seeing bus tour to the Hermitage, ante-bellum home of Andrew Jackson and now a national shrine, is in the plans for today. A picnic lunch will be served at Cabin-by-the-Spring on the grounds. An extended tour will be arranged for

those students who will not be participating in further rounds. It will include a visit to the Parthenon, replica of the Greek temple in Athens, and to Cheekwood, a Georgian mansion now the site of the Tennessee Botanical Gardens and Fine Arts Center.

The speech seminars for coaches, co-ordinated again by Mr. Frank Sferra of Fort Logan-Mullen, Colorado, under the auspices of the Speech Association of America, will consider the subject matter of the 1967-68 debate topic and problems in oral interpretation. The panel for the debate seminar will include Gilbert S. Merritt, Jr., United States Attorney, Nashville; Prof. Nathaniel E. Gozansky of the Vanderbilt School of Law; and Prof. Randall M. Fisher, Director of Forensics at Vanderbilt. Mr. Robert P. Friedman of the National University Extension Association

has worked to secure this panel.

The interpretation seminar is being arranged by Mr. Earl R. Davis, Illinois state coordinator of speech activities. Specific panelists and program are yet to be announced.

Thursday, June 22: A special Coaches' Breakfast is being planned. Final rounds in all events will be held.

The Grand Ole Opry, original country music radio program now televised in many parts of the country, is on the air each Saturday night. To accommodate the large crowds, a similar performance is conducted each Friday night. Visitors who would like to remain for either performance should write in advance for tickets to "Grand Ole Opry," Station WSM, Nashville.

Life and Casualty Insurance Company of Tennessee is underwriting the tournament. The company will present each contestant with a pass to the observation deck of the L & C tower, featured on the cover of the April issue. The tallest building in the mid-South, it commands a spectacular

view of the metropolitan area and the surrounding Middle Tennessee hills. The panorama is especially effective at night. Guilford Dudley is president of the company.

During their free time contestants, as they desire, may also use the swimming and tennis facilities at Lipscomb and visit the Country Music Hall of Fame. Other possible diversions and suggested activities will be listed in a brochure about Nashville which will be given each contestant at registration.

The Tennessee District Committee and those making the arrangements hope that everyone attending will regard June 19-22 as an exciting tournament week, and will return home with memories of Nashville as exemplar of the finest in Southern hospitality.
