Rostrum Editor Named

Named to the editorship of the *NFL Rostrum* was Jack Quitter, a senior at Washington Senior High School, host to the 1958 National Speech Tournament. Jack will serve as editor of the magazine for the school year during which time nine issues are published.

Jack was a member of the Washington High debate squad which participated in the National Tourney. He was appointed editor of the South Dakota Boys State paper and was named Outstanding Journalist by his advisors and colleagues. At school he serves as sports editor of the "Orange and Black," which has received All-American ratings in journalism every year.

He is ranked high in his class scholastically, is Vice President of the NFL Chapter, treasurer of the student body, was a candidate for student council president and is vice-president of the Hi-Y club. Jack has been a member of the student council and president of his homeroom for four years and also placed fifth in the State NFL Extemp meet.

National Officers Re-Elected

In the biennial election of national officers last May, three of the incumbents were re-elected and L. D. Hanks of John Marshall High School in Los Angeles was returned to the Council post he held from 1954 to 1956. Mr. E. J. Diller of Chaney High School in Youngstown, Ohio, was retired after serving on the national board for eight years.

The chapters cast ballots representing 26,427 of the 34,500 votes eligible to be cast on May 25, the closing date for the balloting. That is 76%.

The ballots were counted as prescribed in Regulation No. 9. If no candidate had a majority, the one with fewest votes was eliminated and his ballots were distributed to the second choice indicated on them. This process was repeated until one did get a majority vote. As soon as a person was elected his votes for other offices were counted for the next choice marked on those ballots.

In the following listings the successive columns show the number of votes after each step in the counting process:

Senator Karl E. Mundt, having a majority of all votes cast, was declared elected National President, an office he has held since 1933. His ballots were then distributed according to second choice indicated, with this result:

On the final count, J. Edmund Mayer was elected with 13,219 votes over L. D. Hanks with 13,031. Mr. Mayer has served as Vice-President since 1950.

L. D. Hanks and James F. Hawker were declared elected national directors. Each has served a previous two-year term.

Three other officers are elected by the Council: Supt. L. J. Smith, Prin. Donald F. Piper and Secretary Bruno E. Jacob. Their terms expire next year.

Amendment Ratified

An amendment to the constitution to start giving extra votes on attaining 400 points instead of 300 was approved by 21,892 Yes votes to 4,318 No. It became effective July 1.

Diamond Key coaches cast ten votes whether they have one, two or three diamonds.

Annual Membership Report

The following pages contain a lot of interesting information about NFL Chapters, yours in particular.

In each district the chapters are listed in the order in which they now rank toward the Leading Chapter Award. Those marked # will receive that award this year. Those with year numerals such as ('54) received the award in the year or years indicated. When a chapter received the award its membership total is set back to zero and it starts over again to earn its next award. A presentation is made annually in districts of 25 chapters, less frequently in smaller districts.

The second column shows the rank or place your chapter held in the district last year. Normally a good chapter should advance at least one place closer to the top each year. It is astonishing how many places some chapters do move forward following an active season.

The column marked "new" indicates the number of members and degrees added by the chapter last year. Extra votes for high point totals are not counted here. The 139 shown for Johnstown Catholic and 132 for Coral Gables are not typographical errors. These schools actually added that many members and degrees last year.

The last column shows the total number of members and degrees for each chapter since its founding or since it received a Leading Chapter Award. This is the basis for naming the 24 Leading Chap-

ters for 1958. The Secretary will present these awards at these schools during October and November.

More than half the chapters — 404 to be exact — enrolled more members and degrees than they did a year ago. In 1957 142 chapters gained over the previous year. The average enrollment went up from 19.8 to 21.7 in spite of the fact that 91 chapters were wholly inactive.

Before membership and degree requirements were raised, the average enrollment per chapter was 23.1 in 1954 and 24.6 in 1955.

During the year our district committees granted 78 charters and renewed the charters for six chapters whose membership had expired. At the same time 50 chapters failing to meet charter renewal requirements were dropped from our roster. The net gain of 34 schools brought NFL to 800 chapters in April and left us with 762 at the start of the new school year.

Look over the following pages critically. Compare the record of your school with the record of others, particularly those in your competitive circle. If the record is a good one, keep it that way. If it is not favorable and reflects undeveloped opportunities, set plans afoot for improving that record during the year just beginning so that the report for 1959 will reflect a year of growth, not only in membership attainment but more particularly in the development of the leadership potential of the boys and girls in your charge.
