Rather, they should offer reasoning to support a position of advocacy. Debaters may offer generalized, practical solutions.</li> <li>Crossfire time should be dedicated to questions and answers rather than reading evidence. Evidence may be referred to extemporaneously.</li> <li>No new arguments may be introduced in the Final Focus; however, debaters may include new evidence to support prior arguments.</li> </ul>
