

Self-Nominating to Judge Late Elimination Rounds

1. Log in to [Tabroom.com](https://tabroom.com)
2. On the right side of your screen, click on “National Speech and Debate Tournament” under “Judging.”



3. Toggle the button to “Y” if you identify as a diversity-enhancing judge.

Late Elimination Nominations

Judging a national semifinal or final round is an honor for the judge, and we strive to have the strongest pool of judges possible, with representation from multiple viewpoints and approaches.

You may nominate your judges below to judge late elimination rounds. Judges of late elim rounds must be at least two years out of high school competition.

Please understand this will not guarantee the judge is pooled for a semi/final round. Judges must be available at the tournament on Wednesday, Thursday & Friday; failure to appear for a self-nominated late elim round will forfeit the school's bond.

All judges wishing to be considered for semis/finals judging should also fill out the Diversity Questionnaire whether or not you consider yourself diversity-enhancing. All nominated judges must also have an email and cell phone number on file.
