Champions Chosen in Washington, D.C.

Previous attendance records were broken as 235 schools in 43 states were represented by 382 contestants in the thirty-fifth National Speech Tournament. The tournament, sponsored by NFL, was held June 16-19 on the campus of George Washington University in Washington, D.C. Included in the schedule were preliminary and final rounds of competition, a dance, the coaches' conference, a special seminar under the direction of Dr. James Unger (Georgetown University), a special tour of the White House -all culminating Thursday night in the Lisner Auditorium where final results and awards were made.

TKA to Houston-Lamar

The Tau Kappa Alpha cumulative sweepstakes award was won by Lamar High School, Houston, Texas. The TKA is presented to the school which has accumulated the greatest number of rounds atthe National Tournament, scoring one round per major individual event and two per debate. Once a school wins the trophy, it must begin its count again.

Lamar's total was amassed in 14 trips to the National Tournaments beginning in 1951. Included in the total are a champion in Boys' Extemp, second in debate, second in dramatic interp, second in Girls' Extemp. Lamar won the National Sweepstakes award in 1953 and 1954.

Thirty rounds were added by the Lamar students this year for a total of 217 rounds of National participation. The students Brad Westmorland, David Wade, Tom Sharp, and Chris Pappas, and their coach Mr. Emerson Turner were presented the TKA award by Mr. James F. Hawker, whose Lafayette-Jefferson, Indiana squad won it last year.

Individual Events

With the exception of Original Oratory, the individual event first place winners had comfortable margins. In most cases the judging of the individual event was consistant. Carolyn Ervin (G.E.) and Gary Ward (O.O.) were at Nationals before, but it was the first time for Darren Kelley (D.I.) and Daniel Furniss (B.E.)

Boys' Extemp

Only four students survived the semi-finals to compete for the National Championship.

In analizing the question, "Is There a Decay in the Moral Fiber of People in the U.S.A.?" won this year's event for Daniel Furniss, of Bellarmine Prep., California. He was coached by Mr. James Harville.

Paul Zarefsky of Houston-Bellaire gave the Californian good competition as he finished second with an analysis of "Is Stalinism Growing in Russia?" Discussing the Federal Reserve Board and it influence won the third spot for Brad Westmoreland of Houston-Lamar, Texas; Scott Glabman of Hiland Park, Illinois spoke on Supreme Court Restrictions on the Police.

Girls' Extemp

Four seemed to be the magic number in the individual events. Four girls competed for the National Girls' Extemp title. With a lead of five points going into the finals Carolyn Ervin of Tustin, California, coached by Mr. Ken Turknette, used the Sino-Soviet Split to win the NFL Girls' Extemp event.

Washington Congress Active

The 1969 National Student Congress was called to order on Monday morning, June 16, by speaker protem Gary Stewart, Oregon. The Law Courtroom of George Washington University was the scene of heated debate and parlimentary maneuvering for the days of legislative sessions after preliminary business and committee meetings held that first morning. In such cases the committee did an outstanding job of amending until the legislation contained the best of wording.

Passed was a resolution to abolish the electoral college and elect the president and vice-president by popular vote. This resolution was the amended form of S.R. 11 by the New Jersey District.

The second resolution discussed was S.R. 17 by the Eastern Ohio District. This called for the deployment of the Safeguard Anti-Ballistic Missile System. After long and heated debate the resolution failed to receive the necessary votes for passage.

Florida District's S.B. 6 for the establishment of a guaranteed annual income was debated and finally tabled.

The Oregon District resolution to extend diplomatic recognition to the Republic of Biafra and to extend economic and non-military aid failed.

Most heated debate came from the rewritten form of a bill for complete withdrawal of troops from Vietnam. Debate was heated and emotional. Interest was high. When the votes were

In Memoriam

Miss Rebecca Thaver, who was NFL sponsor at Texas Sunset-Dallas, for more than 20 years and a Diamond Key coach, passed away in July. Her teaching career spanned 42 years. In the last few years she had been suffering from failing health but her one consuming desire was to return to teaching. For the past two years, the Sunset Speech Tournament has been named and held in her honor.

Final Student Congress

Since so few chapters participate in the final district congress, we feel that the majority of schools are not interested in this activitiy. If the chapters do not prove they are interested, the schools will kill congress, not the Council.

The Council has decided that a student must accept his or her first qaulifying win for the national tournament, so the Council suggests that districts hold the final district congress after the district speech and debate tournaments have been held.

This year the district chairmen will apportion the congress. This apportionment will be be made from the last report of chapter strength they receive from the national office. The apportionment will be made on **Tuesday two weeks** before the week in which the congress is to be held. **A copy of the apportionment** shall be sent to the national office.

At least thirty (30) days before the congress date, the district chairman shall send to each participating school a copy of not fewer than four nor more than six bills or resolutions which shall constitute the calendar for each house. At the same time these bills (duplicated or mimeographed) shall be sent to the national office.

There must be twelve (12) chapter schools in the Senate. The students from these schools must be members on record in the national office at the time of the congress. All Senators from these schools must participate actively in legislative debate.

Committee meetings are optional.

There must be four (4) hours of legislative debate in addition to committee meetings and time used for elections.

Not fewer than five (5) days after the congress has adjourned, the report of the congress must be sent to this office on the **Official Report Sheet**, along with a list of the schools attending, the students from each school, and points earned. If committees are a part of the congress, you must list points for committee meetings and points for legislative debate in separate columns.

Study your Congress Manual carefully. If any one rule or regulation is violated, the congress will be declared a no-contest and the student elected to the national congress will be ineligible to attend.

If fewer than twenty (20) districts qualify senators, the national student congress will be cancelled the following year.

Remember, the congress is not an event to be used for drop-outs from speech contests and debate. Hold this event on a date other than that of the district speech and/or debate tournament.
