## 1971 Champions Chosen in California Tournament

244 schools and 449 students were present at the thirty-seventh National Speech Tournament sponsored by **The Reader's Digest Foundation** and under the direction of the National Forensic League. The Tournament was held June 16-19 at Stanford University, Stanford, California. Included in the schedule were a coaches conference and a District Chairmen meeting. Our National Host was Dr. Kenneth E. Mosier, Director of Forensics, Stanford University. Miss Natalie Weber, Sunyvale-Homestead HS. was the California Tournament Committee Chairman. At the banquet many district chairmen were presented with their bronze, silver, or gold awards. A number of coaches were presented their diamond certificates and several received their double diamond plaques. The tournament ended Saturday night, June 19. Final results and awards were made at the conclusion of the championship debate.

### TKA to Northwest Classen, Oklahoma

The Tau Kappa Alpha cumulative sweepstakes award was presented to Northwest Classen High School, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The TKA is presented to the school which has the greatest number of rounds of national participation. Scoring is based upon one point for each round of participation in an individual events contest and two for each debate round. Once a school has received the award the school must begin its count again.

Northwest Classen received their NFL Charter in 1955 and have been to 13 National Tournaments.

32 rounds of national participation were added by Mende Snodgrass and Charles Pierce for a total of 205. Runner-up was Central Catholic High School, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania with 191 rounds of national participation.

### Sweepstake to Marquette University High School

Marquette University High School, Milwaukee, Wisconsin won the Annual Sweepstakes for their school by participating in 77 rounds of competition. This is a new record. The old record was 53 rounds. Sweepstakes points are awarded on the same basis as the Tau Kappa Alpha award but are not cumulative. Tustin High School, Tustin, California was runner-up with 40 rounds of participation, Northwest Classen and Toledo-Whitmer, Ohio tied for third with 32 rounds of competition.

Accumulating rounds for Marquette High School this year were: Mark Foley, Neal Devitt, John Patek, Jeffrey Clark, Peter

Syvertsen, and Robert Gumerlock. These young men were coached by Mr. James Copeland. Mr. Copeland received an engraved silver tray as NFL's Coach of the Year. This is the second time Mr. Copeland has been named Coach of the Year.

### High Point Students

High Point student at the 1971 tournament was Paul Turner of Toledo-Whitmer High School, Ohio. Paul was a member of the Championship Debate Team and placed fourth in Boys' Extemp. His total of 154 points is a new record. The old record was 144 points. In second place was Julianne Christensen of Lafayette High School, Lafayette, Louisiana with 127 points, and Lawrence Artenian, Hoover High School-

Fresno, California, third with a total of 117.

# National Student Congress - 1971

*Report by Mr. Roger Klingman, Wichita-South HS, Kansas*

"Conservative with a touch of liberal," that is how one senator described this year's National Student Congress. The most liberal measures, legalization of marijuana for example, were defeated: most of those which did pass were amended. Some examples of legislation that passed are: financial aid to victims of crimes, legalized abortion, withdrawal from Viet Nam, recognition of Red China, and an end to the production of offensive nuclear weapons.

One piece of humorously motivated legislation noted, in contrast to last year's Senate, the presence of two lady Senators. A resolution was passed prohibiting discrimination against Senators on account of their "race, creed, color, sex," etc.

The opening session was quite unusual. For the first time in the history of National Student Congress, the host Senator (the Senator in whose district the Congress is being held and who acts as temporary chairman) was elected as Presiding Officer.

In the first piece of legislation to be considered, the Senate addressed itself to the return to a full Congress of both House and Senate. By unanimous resolution they thanked the Executive Committee and proposed a method for selecting members of the National House of Representatives.

Whether it was on the floor or outside the chamber, Senators did a great deal of reflecting on the existence of Student Congress. All believed that the return to the National House of Representa-

tives would increase district participation. "But the House will probably be less effective than the Senate," noted Senator Schenkler of New Jersey, "because the people who go in the House at district aren't as good as those in the Senate."

Other suggestions were made for improving National Student Congress. A great deal of confusion in the opening session could have been prevented if the Senators had familiarized themselves with the national rules before the formal opening. Senator Helin of Minnesota pointed out the "lack of uniformity in procedures at the district level" and the "unfamiliarity with national rules" made it necessary to take time from debate to discuss operational procedures.

Senator Davis of Colorado, the only returning Senator, thought an informal get together the night before the opening session would allow everyone to ask questions about the national rules, suggest procedure for recognition of speakers, etc., and get to know ones fellow Senators better.

Following the final session it was Senator Jones of Florida who suggested that one of the meaningful benefits of Student Congress is the opportunity of working with people from different parts of the country with different beliefs. That is probably what I will remember the longest."

The 1971 National Student Congress was called to order on Wednesday morning June 16, 1971 by speaker pro tem

Steve Robinson, Sunnyvale High School, California.

The Student Congress Trophy, similar to the Tau Kappa Alpha tournament was awarded to Monessen High School, Pennsylvania with 34 National Congress points. Monessen High School was represented by Senator Allan Sacharow.

### Senate Awards

Judges of each Congress session submit names for superior senators. The Senate itself narrows this list to six, and from the group elects by secret ballot a Most Outstanding Senator. The honor went to Senator Larry Jones, Miami Carol City HS, Fla. Runner-up was Frank Stewart, Manhattan, Kansas.
