1973 Champions Chosen in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

At the 1973 National Forensic League Speech, Debate, and National Student Congress 281 schools and 469 students were present at the thirty-ninth National Speech Tournament sponsored by the **Reader's Digest Foundation** and under the direction of the National Forensic League. The Tournament was held at the University of Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Included in the schedule were a dinner meeting and awards session for the past year's District Chairmen and newly elected chairmen present at the tournament. A District Chairmen's meeting and a Coaches Conference were also held during tournament time.

Our National Hosts were Mr. Vernon W. Metz, NFL Vice-President and Chairman of the Pittsburgh NFL District and Dr. Thomas Kane, Director of Forensics at the University of Pittsburgh.

The Tournament Banquet was held Monday evening at the William Pitt Hotel. The guest speaker was Mr. Fletcher L. Byrom, Chairman of the Board-Koppers Company, Inc.

The Tournament ended Thursday night June 21, 1973 as awards were presented to the Champions and Runners-up. A number of coaches were presented their diamond key certificates and double diamond awards.

National Trophy

The Delta Sigma Rho-Tau Kappa Alpha Honorary Speech Fraternity Trophy was presented to Central Catholic HS, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. The trophy is presented to the school which has the greatest number of accumulated rounds of National Participation. The scoring is based upon one point for each round of individual events participation and two points for each round of debate.

Catholic Central HS received its NFL Charter November 20, 1958, and has been to the National Tournament 12 times.

Sweepstakes to Marquette HS, Wisconsin

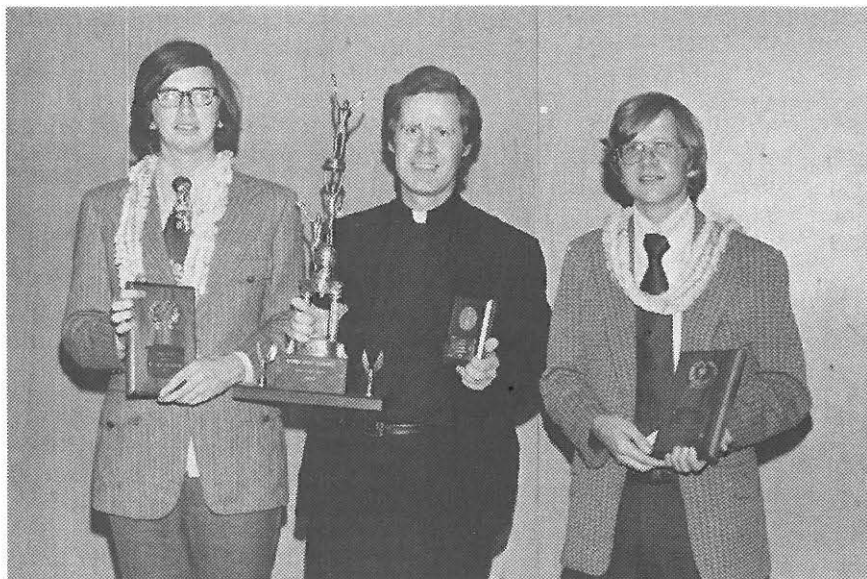

Gilbert Skillman and Craig Meeker from Fairmont-East HS, Kettering, Ohio were second. They were coached by Mr. M. J. Mogus.

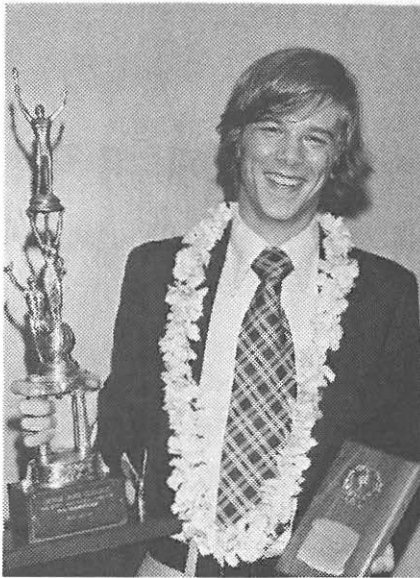

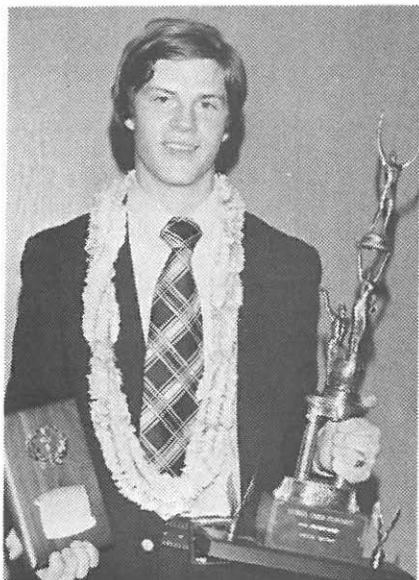

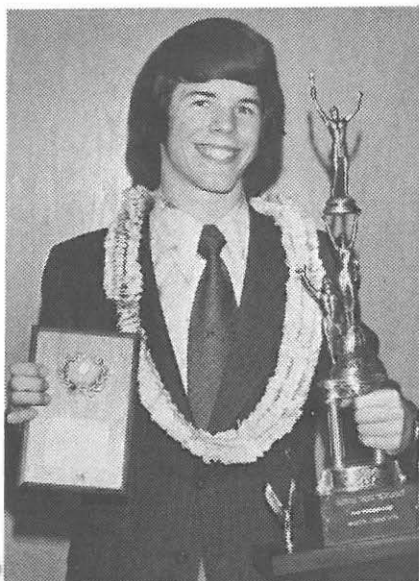

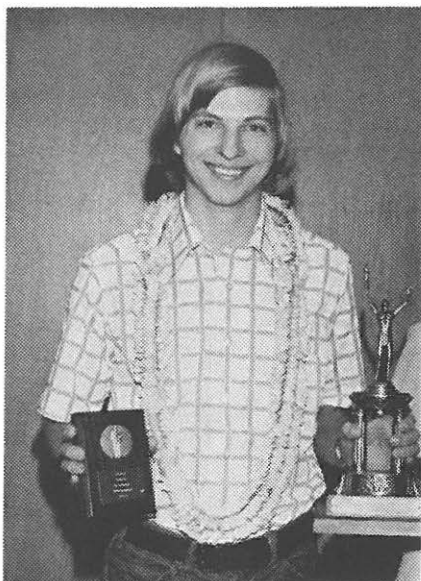

Radio and Impromptu

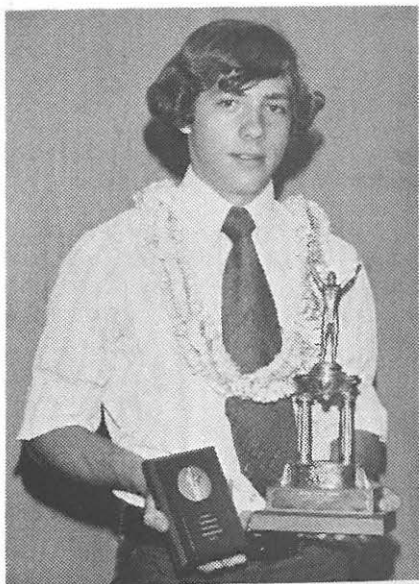

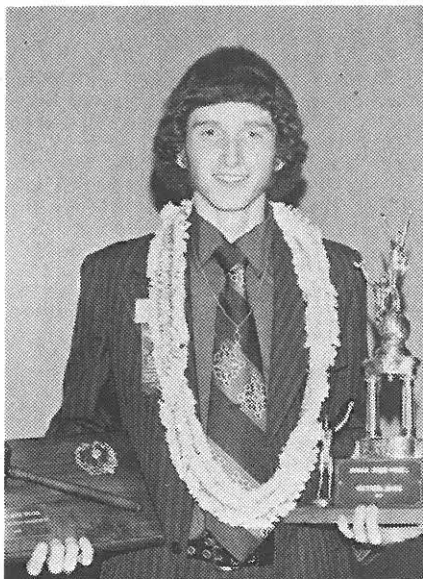

Minutes of the Executive Council Meeting

June 16 and 22, 1973, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

Present: James F. Hawker, Vernon W. Metz, Lester M. Tucker, H. B. Mitchell, Frank Sferra, Carmendale Fernandes, James Copeland, C. Edwin Brower, Arlene Akerman as proxy for Prin. Meyer.

The following actions were taken:

That we centralize all manuals and the constitution in a single loose leaf book using title dividers.

That a district congress with 15 or more schools represented be entitled to send one member to the national senate and one member to the national house of representatives. Those districts where there are 14 schools or fewer may send one senator to the national senate and none to the national house of representatives.

That we redraft the application form for district congress.

That we limit the campaign for Executive Council of NFL to the space made available in the **Rostrum** and that equal space in the **Rostrum** be made available to all candidates in the same issue.

That the rule concerning the recording of contests held on Sunday be eliminated.

That the number of entries from a chapter school shall be based on the number of active members and degrees on record in the national office for that chapter (7) seven days before the tournament.

That the name of the national tournament be changed to the National Forensic League Tournament.

That there should be no rank lower than a five (5) given on the ballot at the district tournament and the NFL National Tournament.

That we do not send out any de-

bate materials and purchase only the minimum number of copies of the Forensic Quarterly necessary to retain our membership in NUFEA, beginning the 1974-'75 school year.

That those coaches who have left NFL coaching but who had the proper number of points at the time of their leaving be eligible to purchase appropriate keys upon application to the national office.

That financial payment for judging and service at the national tournament be terminated as of July 1.

That we abandon creditpoint record sheet recording priority system.

Previously all credit point record sheets from a district about to hold its district tournament were culled from the daily mail and was given priority recording rights. Many coaches would wait until the last minute to send in their reports. This caused a backlog of recording. The recorders were working six and some times seven days a week in order to record points so that the schools would be able to send their maximum to the district tournament. While this system was beneficial to a school and a district about to hold its tournament, it was also unfair to those coaches who sent in credit point reports periodically.

That Mr. Lester Tucker be employed as Executive Secretary for two years.

That Mr. Albert Odom be rehired for a two year term.

That Supt. H. B. Mitchell be re-elected for a two year term.

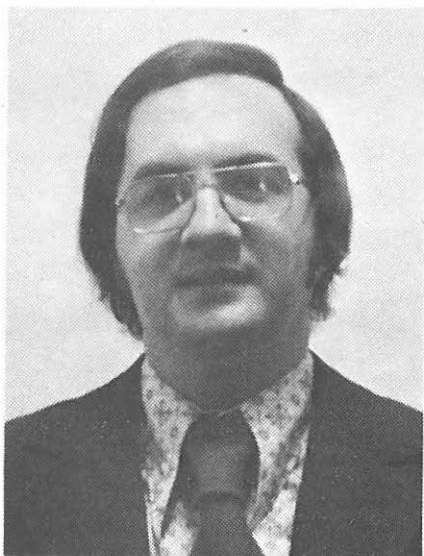

Although the minutes of the Executive Council meeting are included in this issue, I want to stress the importance of your checking and re-checking changes in rules and procedures.

Fifteen (15) schools must be present at the district congress if that district is to be represented at the national congress with a Senator and a Representative. With fewer than fifteen, only a Senator will represent your district.

Also recall the old rule that states, "If a student qualifies for both National Congress and National Tournament, he may enter only the one in which he qualified first".

The priority system (used during district tournament time) of recording points in the national office has been abandoned. This means that reports must be sent in regularly.

To be eligible to participate in the district tournament, contestants must be members of NFL on record in the national office seven (7) days before that tournament. Affiliate members must have 250 points (degree of distinction) on record in the national office seven (7) days before that tournament.

In states where teams or contestants are divided into classes, only the winners of Class A or equivalent highest ranking classification are eligible to enter the national tournament, and the contestant must be a member of NFL on record in the national office at the time of the state tournament.
