**Executive Council Minutes
Saturday, June 11, 1983
Hilton Hotel
Kansas City, Missouri**

Moved and seconded that the Oklahoma District be divided into two districts according to the petition from Oklahoma. Carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded that the Oregon District be divided into two districts as outlined in their petition. Carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded that the National Forensic League sponsor a conference on the State of Debate in the United States. Carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded to raise the number of quoted words allowed in original oratory to 200 words. Defeated: Noes: Fernandes, Barton, Sferra, Bro. Rene Sterner, Last, Mitchell, Winfield. Ayes: Roberts, Copeland.

Moved and seconded that a student may use only one cutting from a source in NFL district or national competition. Carried unanimously.

The subject of releasing the debate topic later was discussed at length and decided to postpone until after the conference on debate.

Moved and seconded that the Michigan District be put on probation for one year to see if that district can get up to the requirements for a district. Carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded that the NFL bar any electrical retrieval information system for the use in any NFL contest. Carried

unanimously.

Moved and seconded that students may have published books, magazines, newspapers and journals or articles therefrom, provided:

A. They are originals or zeroxed copies of the originals.

B. That original or copy is intact and uncut.

C. There is not written material on that original or copy.

D. Topical index without annotation may be present.

No other material shall be allowed in the extemp prep room other than stated above. Extemp speeches, handbooks, briefs and outlines shall be barred from the extemp prep room. Carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded that beginning in 1985 a single contest in extemp will be held at the NFL district and national tournament. Carried: Ayes: Copeland, Barton, Roberts, Bro. Rene Sterner, Mitchell, Last and Winfield. Noes: Sferra, Fernandes.

Moved and seconded that only items appearing on the agenda 30 days before the NFL Executive Council meeting shall be considered unless unanimous approval is given by the Executive Council. Carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded that Mr. Ronald Last and Mr. H.B. Mitchell be reappointed to the NFL Executive Council representing the school administrators. Carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded that the NFL Executive Secretary ap-

point a committee to study a new event since extemp has been combined into one event. Carried unanimously. The following people were appointed: Brother Rene Sterner, Donus Roberts, Dr. Joan Dilweg, Thomas McClain and Tedd D. Woods.

Moved and seconded that we specify that we will replace the extemp event with an original rhetorical event. Carried unanimously.

Moved and seconded that beginning in the 1983-84 school year, there shall be two options for qualification to the NFL National Tournament. (Passed unanimously.)

1. The first and second place winners in each national qualifying speech and debate event at the NFL district tournament shall advance to the national tournament. (Congress qualifications: 8 or fewer schools participating shall qualify two national entries; and 9 or more schools participating shall qualify four national entries.)

2. The first place winner in each national qualifying speech and debate event at the district tournament shall advance to the national tournament. (Congress qualification: 8 or fewer schools

participating shall qualify one national entry and 9 or more schools participating shall qualify two national entries.) The first place winner in each national qualifying event at the official state activities association tournament shall advance to the national tournament if such winner is an NFL member.

Implementation

A. Prior to October 15 in each year the NFL district chairperson(s) or Executive Secretary shall conduct a vote in each state among NFL chapter schools to determine which option is to be selected for that school year. Each chapter shall have one vote and a majority of the votes cast in each state shall prevail.

B. Where two or more states comprise an NFL district the chairman shall conduct a vote among NFL chapters in each state separately to determine each state's preference. Each individual state will be governed by its own vote.

C. Beginning with the 1984-85 school year, state winners that can advance to the national tournament must be determined by the official contest conducted by the state activities association.

1983 TOURNAMENT WINNERS

At the 1983 National Speech, Debate Tournament and National Student Congress schools were represented by 949 students. The fifty-third NFL National Tournament was held at Park Hill High School and the National Student Congress at Oak Park High

School in Kansas City Missouri. Our National Hosts were Mr. Donald Crabtree of Park Hill High School and Mr. Richard Rice of Oak Park High School.

the memory of Mr. Bruno E. Jacob, founder of the National Forensic League, was presented to Eau Claire-Memorial High School, Eau Claire, Wisconsin.

The award is presented to the school which has the largest number of accumulated rounds of National participation. The scoring is based upon one point for each round of individual event participation and two points for each round of cross-examination debate.

Ninety-four rounds of National participation in 1983 were added to the previous total of 381 for a grand total of 475 rounds. The participation points this year were earned by Bill Cayley, Scott Halloin, Kevin Myren, David Schimke, Rachel Woodward, Tammy Young, Darel Jevens, and Rick Pitterle. These young people were coached by Mr. Art McMillion and Mrs. Ruth McMillion.

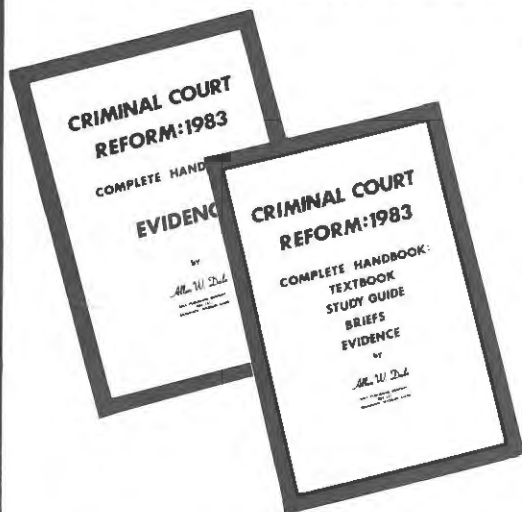

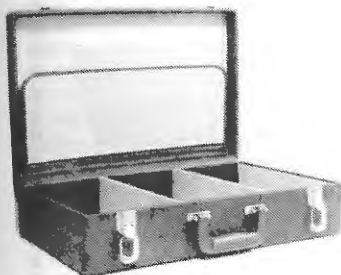

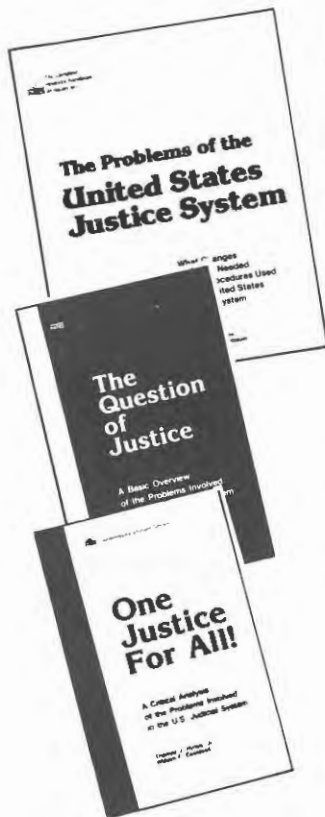
